Things That Are Challenging by John B Daniels

We're always hearing about one challenge or another. I think Pepsi has been doing a challenge since the 70's. I have heard that several "reality shows" on TV deal with things that are challenging.

Paul gives some challenging words in 1 Timothy 4:7-10: "But refuse profane and old wives' fables, and exercise thyself rather unto godliness. For bodily exercise profiteth little: but godliness is profitable unto all things, having promise of the life that now is, and of that which is to come. This is a faithful saying and worthy of all acceptance. For therefore we both labour and suffer reproach, because we trust in the living God, who is the Savior of all men, specially of those that believe."

Most people don't really care about godliness. In fact, the more ungodly some become, the more ungodly they want to be! Yet, it is for our own benefit if we become godly! Paul said it is valuable now as well as in eternity!

Some people think that godliness is a sign of weakness. But that's not the case! Weakness can be seen in those who have little or no control over their temper, or their passions, or their tongues. That doesn't mean Christians should never get angry. We should also be passionate about our love for God. We certainly need to speak up about a lot of things the way the world is going.

To live godly is not an easy thing. If not temptation, then turmoil attacks our godliness so that we lose patience. To live godly may be a difficult thing, but it is a good thing. To live godly brings hope. To live godly builds trust. To live godly is the real challenge. "For therefore we both labour and suffer reproach, because we trust in the living God, who is the Saviour of all men, specially of those that believe."

Yes, many things in life are challenging, but none as challenging as living a godly life. It may be challenging but the rewards are out of this world!!!

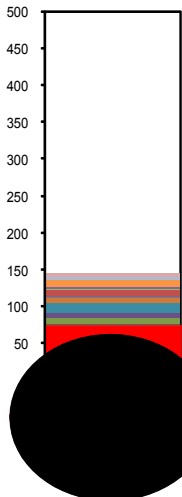

Our God is great! Our God has answered our prayers! (Zechariah 10:1) Zimbabwe has been reeling under numerous droughts for many years. During those hard times, you, our brothers and sisters in the United States and Canada never grew weary in feeding hundreds of starving families. Your love and care cascaded boundaries and you managed to save many lives through your kindness. You fulfilled the commandment of Christ that we should not love by "word" only but by our "deeds". (IJohn 3:18) Surely, we whole heartedly thank all of you for your wonderful sacrifice. Since January 2014, Zimbabwe has been receiving above average rainfall throughout the country. The Meteorological Services Department is forecasting more heavy rains country-wide. This is good news to all rural farmers. Already the ground is soaked and there is likelihood that any runoff that occurs might potentially trigger flash flooding in vleis, poorly drained soils, streams and rivers. Even so, people here do welcome this wet spell and are very grateful to God. (IJohn 5:14) (excerpted from Velaphi's January 2014 report)
