MARCH 2019 MONTHLY REPORT : PART 2 Cyclone Idai and drought

The Lord's church in Zimbabwe managed to donate clothing and food items to the survivors of Cyclone Idai which brought so much devastation and death of more than 300 people in the eastern districts of Zimbabwe. The nation is still mourning and in a state of shock because many people are still buried under the mud and rock debris while thousands of homes were completely destroyed and many dead bodies washed to the sea. South Africa has provided Zimbabwe with sniffer dogs so that they can locate those still buried under cyclone debris. Many countries including Britain and the United States have sent money, clothing and food to help the victims of this cyclone. The United States President Donald Trump helped Zimbabwe with almost three million dollars and the British Queen Elizabeth also

sent a large consignment of items to help survivors of this cyclone.

Zimbabwe is currently languishing in real disasters as the terrible drought has also affected all provinces in the country. The few crops which were doing well in the eastern highlands in Zimbabwe were all washed away by the cyclone while simultaneously all crops in other parts of the country were destroyed by the scorching sun. Zimbabwe has never experienced such a phenomenon. God knows how His people will survive this year.

Food relief

We managed to distribute food to 80 families in three congregations during the month in review. These congregations are Sailor Jack, Mvana and Dando. The brethren there were very grateful indeed and requested that we thank you our brothers and sisters at Rainbow for your great sacrifice in helping them with

food during these hard times. Gogo Mugere of Mvana shed tears of joy when she received a bag of mealie meal (staple food). In many rural areas shops are almost empty and it is now very difficult to get mealie meal in those areas. We therefore once again appeal to you our brothers and sisters at Rainbow and other sister congregations in the United States, that you may continue assisting the poor with food in the rural areas. God is pleased whenever we extend our hand by helping the poor. Imagine, just because of sharing our food with the needy, God will open the doors of heaven for us. (Matthew 25:31-46). We are happy that later this year, brother Craig and other brethren from sister congregations in USA will visit congregations in Zimbabwe to see the work which they are supporting. They will see clearly how bad the food deficit situation is in the rural areas. TO BE CONTINUED
