IT IS FINISHED

What a great week we had last week. It was an especially great week for me. Two events came to a close, one far too quickly, the other a seemingly endless journey. The later was the conclusion of my second semester and first year back in school after many years. I took four classes the last fall and five this spring. I am glad to be done and was relieved to say upon submitting my final paper and taking all my final exams that "It is finished!"

We also concluded our Spring Gospel Meeting with brother Earl Edwards. It was a wonderful event and brother Edwards did a fabulous job presenting a series of lessons about our Lord Jesus, the Christ. Unlike my semester of school this event ended way too soon, but at the end we could look back and say, "It is finished" and be thankful for the blessings of this event.

About a month ago another monumental event came to fruition. We finally closed on the purchase of the farm. After many years of waiting and many hours of work and prayer we finally own the property and have the room necessary to move forward in our efforts to grow physically and spiritually. We also have another foundational tool which will enable us to spread the gospel of Jesus and be a light to all the world. I know there are several that symbolically, if not literally, sat back and exclaimed, "It is finished."

What amounts to a historic event and ending for some may well go unnoticed by the masses. The conclusions to some events hold little import to anyone other than a single soul while others have far greater reach. These iconic words, "It is finished," held the greatest worldwide significance when spoken by a carpenter's son at his execution. But He was more than just a man; He was the Man! Jesus of Nazareth; the Son of God.

When He cried out these words from the cruel Roman cross He was indicating that His work here on earth was done. He had come to fulfill God's promise of salvation (1 Cor 15:3-5; Rom 1:1-4). He had come to do the will of the Father and to fulfill all righteousness (Matt 3:15). He had come to seek and save the lost (Luke 19:10). He had come to show the Father's love (John 3:16). And with His final breath he cried out, "It is finished," and he died (John 19:30). This single moment in time, the life ending, life-giving act is the single most important moment in human history!

But the work of God did not end with the death of His Son on the cross. Three days later the Father brought forth His Son from the grave where He had been laid (Matt 28:6; 1 Pet 1:3). In Acts 2 the Holy Spirit came to do His work in proving and delivering the word. God has been active in our lives providentially ever since bestowing upon the obedient, faithful child all spiritual blessings in Christ Jesus our Lord (Eph 1:3).

"It is finished" in this life does not mean that the work is done! This fall I will register for more classes that I hope will benefit me spiritually as well as others as I continue to minister, preach and teach. The work of brother Edwards is not done here as we take the messages shared and apply them and share them with others. The purchase of the land is not the end but another beginning, onward and upward to be what God wants us to be and to give Him the praise and glory He deserves.

No, the fields are white unto harvest (John 4:35) and let us not grow weary in doing well (2 Thess 3:13). We need to heed to the words of Jesus, "We must work the works of Him who sent Me, as long as it is day; night is coming, when no man can work" (John 9:4).
