**Faulty Memories** *by Jason T Carter*

I had an idea for a bulletin article earlier in the week but didn't write it down immediately, and when it came time to submit an article, I had forgotten all about the idea. That's not the first time it has happened.

Maybe mankind's faulty memory is why God instituted so many memorials. Going all the way back to the flood when God instituted the rainbow as a memorial, not for the people, but for Himself. In Genesis 8:16, God said, "The rainbow shall be in the cloud, and I will look on it to remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is on the earth." At times, I get frustrated at the appropriation of the rainbow by the homosexual community, but maybe it is by God's providential design. That rainbow represents a promise that no matter how wicked the world becomes, the Almighty will not destroy it again by flood.

Other memorials God instituted in the Old Testament

include the Passover(Exodus 12:24-27), the jar of manna (Exodus 16:32-33), the twelve stones (Joshua 4:5-7), and even the Sabbath day itself (Exodus 20:8-11).

Still today, under the new covenant, we observe a memorial on the first day of every week. Christ instituted the Lord's Supper just prior to His death on the cross. He said of the unleavened bread, "This is My body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of Me" (Luke 22:19). Christ's human life was not taken from Him; He gave it for us. What an amazing gift! He followed this with the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which is shed for you" (Luke 22:20). There is power in that blood, power to cleanse us of our sins so we might stand blameless before God.

I am thankful God gave us the Lord's Supper so that we can continually, week by week, remember the awesome gift of His Son and the power of His blood.

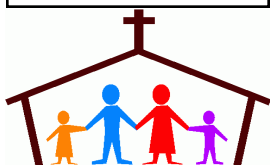

### JULY 2018 MONTHLY REPORT: PART 2

#### Baptism

We are happy to inform you that sixteen people surrendered their lives to the Lord and were baptized during the month in review. Nine were baptized at the Fellowship Sunday in Nkulumane were brother Dorian preached. We give all glory to God!

#### Food Relief

Last month, our visitors from USA bought and distributed food to the needy Christians at Ntabazinduna. The Christians there were very grateful indeed. Ntabazinduna is a very dry area and has perennial droughts. While at Ntabazinduna, our visitors also went to see a borehole which our brothers and sisters in the United States dug through their funds. They were happy to see brother and sister Dube's irrigation garden.

We also managed to assist our needy brothers and sisters in Binga. We distributed \$800 to ten Binga preachers who attended the Preachers Refresher

Course so that they would buy food for the needy in their respective areas. All in all, 130 needy families in Binga were assisted with food in July through this program. We have already received messages thanking the brethren at Rainbow for remembering these Christians facing hunger in Binga. They all said: "twalumba kapati" meaning thank you very much and may God bless you. We say to the leadership and all our loving brothers and sisters at Rainbow Church of Christ, thank you so much and may God bless you for your great kindness.

#### Preaching and Teaching

During the month in review, we preached and taught the Bible to many people at Chesa Forest, Bulawayo Central, Nesby Farm, Inyathi and at the World Bible School. We thank the Lord for giving us wisdom and strength to do His will.

#### Zimbabwe Elections

In the history of this country, we have never had such peaceful elections. It was just great. However the post

election period was marred by a small group of youths whose demonstration turned violent when their party got few parliamentary seats. In the ensuing melee soldiers used unnecessary force to quell this noise when six people were shot dead. However since then, there is now peace and tranquility throughout the country. Media reports also indicate that all hotels are fully booked especially in all resort areas. Many tourists are currently flocking into the country and all citizens are carrying on with their normal day to day business. Zimbabwe is still a safe country to visit. The incumbent president says Zimbabwe is now open for business and has started to engage with the business community worldwide. The ruling party won by two thirds majority votes while the opposition got one third. We still need your prayers for Zimbabwe to come out from economic doldrums and catch up with other developing countries.
