GOD OUR SAVIOR Isaiah 21-25 by Tim Dooley

God, through the prophet Isaiah, contrasts Himself with the various manmade gods of which those in the Ancient Near East were so fond. In fact, the children of Israel had also put their hope and trust in these so-called gods. Time and again the prophet of God says the One true God of Israel is the Lord and there is no other savior. The Lord could do physically what the idols of man could never do. Likewise, spiritually, He could do what they could not. He could blot out the sins of His people. And while some would bow their knee or swear to, and by, images of

wood or stone, eventually ever knee would bow to the Lord and every tongue would confess His name.

The idols might have changed but the principle taught herein has not. Men today still worship and bow to images and gods (i.e. sports, money, pleasures, power, entertainment, recreation...) that are no gods. They put their trust in temporal things that cannot satisfy them, sanctify them, or save them. There is only one Savior and one Hope. What are you putting before the Lord? Obey Him and be faithful. JULY MONTHLY REPORT: PART 2

Baptism

Our brothers and sisters, we are very happy to inform you that during the month of July 2019, 68 souls obeyed the Gospel Truth and were baptized. Oh! What a wonderful month! Glory be to God! Is it not wonderful to see all these people realising their sinfulness and surrendering their lives to the Lord! Please pray for these newly born so that they may grow spiritually and always set their minds "on things above".

Preaching and teaching

We are happy that in Zimbabwe, we continue preaching the Gospel to all provinces of the country unhindered. The areas we visited during the month in review include Stanhope, Lushonkwe, Ntabazinduna, Zhilo, Malungwana, Bayethe and Pumula South. Brother Khulekani Dube and his wife from Bear Valley Bible School have been attached to work with Stanhope congregation for two months since June 2019. They have been visiting villagers in the area preaching to the lost and conducting almost daily evening devotions. Villagers came to these devotions in great numbers to listen to God's

Word. We are happy that many people were receptive to this preaching. Thus 23 souls have been baptized so far. We give praise to the Lord!

Food Distribution

We thank the elders and all our brothers and sisters at Rainbow for increasing the amount for drought relief in Zimbabwe. 82 needy families were assisted with food during the month of July 2019. They were all extremely grateful indeed as many rural families are only able to have one decent meal a day. May our God continue blessing you!
