We are happy to inform you that the Zimbabwean government has banned the importation of maize meal from neighbouring countries and abroad since the beginning of August 2016. It pointed out that because of the bumper harvest countrywide, there is no need of importing mealie meal as our grain silos are now full to capacity. It said no one will starve this year as there is enough food for all in the country. We thank God for answering our prayers for good rains. We hope and pray that God will give us good rains again this coming summer season.

Report from Nqobizitha and Jacob

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Hoping everyone is well as we continue working in the Lord's vineyard. We are already in the third quarter of the year. Time is flying. We praise the Lord for being with us this dear even through challenges.

On the first week of the month, we planted drip irrigation gardens where our rural brethren planted kale and onions. We continue with drip irrigation programme as it has saved many lives physically and spiritually. Thank you very much for introducing this farming tool. Our rural brethren rely on it and they are very grateful.

On the first day of the week we worshipped with the congregation in Thuthuka. We had a blessed service there. On that day three people obeyed the Gospel message and were baptised. The second week of the

month we worshipped with our local congregation encouraging one another in hymns, prayer and the Word of God.

The mortality rate remains very high especially in rural areas. On the third week of the month, we lost two, of our brethren in Mtshabezi and Bayethe simultaneously. We had to travel there for the funerals and burials because our brethren and the Xhurch need our support in such difficult times.

On the last week of the month, we attended the Matebeleland Gospel Meeting at Stanmore where several congregations met for two days, with very fruitful lessons and wonderful Sunday service.

Thank you very much for all the support, in all the Lord's work, and everything done for His glory. We pray that the Lord will continue to strengthen our bond in all good works Gal. 6:9.
