The Value of One

During the American Revolutionary War Nathan Hale, a soldier for the Continental Army, volunteered for an intelligence-gathering mission in New York City but was captured by the British and hanged. He is best remembered for his alleged last words, "I only regret that I have but one life to give for my country." Regret as you might Mr. Hale, you do indeed only have one.

Several weeks ago I had a man suggest to me that he was like a cat because God had given him nine lives and he was on number six. But "cheating death" or "beating the odds" do not constitute more lives but perhaps are an indication of the longsuffering of God to repent and obey for those "lives" run out.

The Hebrew writer reminds us "*it is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment*" (Hebrews 9:27). We read in Ecclesiastes, "*Remember your Creator before the silver cord is loosed, Or the golden bowl is broken, Or the pitcher shattered at the fountain, Or the wheel broken at the well. Then the dust will return to the earth as it was, And the spirit will return to God who gave it*" (Ecclesiastes 12:6-7). Last week during a golf round on of the girls on the team, who wasn't feeling well, looked at me and said, "I'm dying!" To which I replied, "From the day we are born." The newspaper is filled every day with obituaries of souls who have gone on into eternity. Their one life spent.

What are we as Christians to do? The fact is we are surrounded by souls who we love and care about. Souls that are precious to God. Paul wrote, "For the love of Christ compels us, because we judge thus: that if One died for all, then all died; and He died for all, that those who live should live no longer for themselves, but for Him who died for them and rose again" (2 Corinthians 5:14-15). In the parable of the lost coin Jesus said, "Likewise, I say to you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents" (Luke 15:10). Notice that the rejoicing is not the angels but God due to his love for the soul of the repentant sinner.

Do we love and count as precious the souls of those friends and family members who are lost and in jeopardy of losing their eternal lives? The gospel must be preached for it is the power of God unto salvation (Romans 1:16). Paul said by inspiration, "*But we have this treasure in earthen vessels...*" (2 Corinthians 4:7). In the next chapter he says, "*Knowing, therefore, the terror of the Lord, we persuade men...*" (5:11).

Many people will find themselves proclaiming for eternity "I only regret that I had but one soul, one life, one chance." But Jesus has made it possible through His blood to never have to utter such heartrending words. Our responsibility as Christians is to share the message of His salvation! We have a great opportunity to put this plan of God into action in the next few weeks. Our Fall Seminar with Dave Miller next weekend and our Friends and Family Day on the last Sunday of the month are perfect openings to invite someone to come and hear about the love of God. It's up to us and if one soul responds, all the efforts will be worth it. That's the value of one!

Its up to you! Paul wrote, "Take heed to yourself and to the doctrine. Continue in them, for in doing this you will save both yourself and those who hear you" (1 Timothy 4:16).

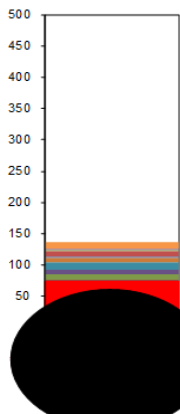
