Make Me A Servant by Jason T Carter

Have you ever been asked to do something that you thought was beneath you? Perhaps your boss at work, or a teacher at school, or even an elder in the church has asked you to do something that you might consider menial, that anyone could do, and how dare they waste your time by asking you to perform that service!

Consider the opening lines to "The Servant Song":

Make me a servant / Lord, make me like You /

For You are a servant / Make me one too.

In this song, we affirm that Jesus was a servant. There are many examples of Jesus taking on the role of a servant in the Scriptures. One that immediately comes to my mind is found in John 13:1-17, as Jesus washed the feet of His disciples.

Dirty, smelly feet. Walking around all day in sandals on the dirt roads in the first century was sure to make anyone's feet stink, and the task of washing feet was usually reserved for a servant. In John 13, Jesus—"knowing that the Father had given all things into His hands, and that He had come from God and was going to God"—became that servant. By filling this role, Jesus truly "made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant" (Philippians 2:7).

Jesus knew who He was, and He knew that His time to leave this world was almost upon Him, but the disciples needed to learn a very important lesson.

Think back to the attitude of James and John, and their request of Jesus as recorded in Mark 10:35-45. They said to the Lord, "Teacher, we want You to do for us whatever we ask." Can you imagine the gall of demanding "whatever we ask" from the Messiah? Jesus humored them, asking, "What do you want Me to do for you?" In verse 37, they said, "Grant us that we may sit, one on Your right hand and the other on Your left, in Your glory." Jesus answered diplomatically, stating that it was not His place to appoint who would sit where. But the other apostles were "greatly displeased" with the sons of Zebedee when they learned of the conversation. The passage ends with Jesus stating His mission as a servant: "For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many."

Christ wanted to rid His followers of pride and selfish ambition. If they were to become leaders in the first century church, they had to first become servants. In order to teach them this, Jesus took it upon Himself to perform a task that was seen as one of the lowest, most degrading acts of service one could possibly do in the first century. In so doing, He shows that every act of service—no matter how ignoble—is important, and everyone needs to be willing to serve whenever needed.

"If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example, that you should do as I have done to you. Most assuredly, I say to you, a servant is not greater than his master; nor is he who is sent greater than he who sent him." (John 13:14-16)

Think about some acts of service that you can perform for others—in the church, at school or work, or in your own house. Opening doors for others, picking up trash from the pews (it doesn't matter who left it there—if you see it, pick it up), volunteering to do whatever is needed. "Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all, especially to those who are of the household of faith." (Galatians 6:10)
