SETBACKS by Jason T Carter

I experienced a bit of a setback this past week. Five and a half weeks after my back surgery, some of the pain started to come back. Emotionally discouraged and physically exhausted, my hope was that the pain was temporary and I took a little comfort in knowing that I was not completely healed but the pain should again decrease in the coming weeks as the mending continued.

Can this happen to us spiritually? Of course it can. The "fiery darts of the wicked one" (Ephesians 6:16) will come at us from every direction. We bring you greetings from Zimbabwe. We hope and trust you will enjoy reading this report concerning the progress of the Lord's work in Zimbabwe during the month of October 2018.

Lessons from Micheal

A man wept when interviewed by CNN in Florida when he showed the journalists where his house used to stand. It was demolished by hurricane Michael, one of the most dangerous and destructive hurricanes in the modern United States. Hundreds of other Florida citizens suffered the same fate. Another man interviewed told CNN : "I

have lost everything I have worked for in my whole life. How will I recover from this great loss and where do I begin?" My beloved brothers and sisters, some of us might take this incident as a natural phenomenon. But what do we Christians learn from such deadly disasters? Even if some of us are thousands of kilometres/miles from Florida, the aftermath of this hurricane was heart rending to most of us in Zimbabwe. We felt so sorry for all those people who were affected by this destruction. What do we learn from this unfortunate incident? We will only mention just two things. The first one is that we must never ever put our hearts on the mate-

rial possessions we have. We must enjoy them while we still have them but realize that they can be wiped off from our grip within a short space of time. Our faith in God is the only true everlasting possession which can never be wiped off if we remain faithful to Him unto death. Rev 2:10. Secondly: Such tragedies remind us about the need to appreciate our families all the time. Imagine losing your family in the twinkle of an eye? That kind of loss is very possible and can happen to anyone and at anytime and is unbearable. So, we must never take our families for granted because they are very precious indeed and are irreplaceable. IJohn 4:7.
